A documentary about an orchid might seem like a bore until you consider the drama surrounding one particular Peruvian flower at Marie Selby Botanical Gardens.

Filmmaker Rich Walton's "The Judge, the

Hunter, the Thief and the Black Orchid," explores the story of the Kovachii orchid, which ended up in Selby Gardens five years ago after an orchid trader smuggled the plant into the United States from Peru.

The Kovachii, considered the most important orchid species discovered in South America in the last 100 years, triggered, according to Walton, an international scandal that nearly brought down The Gardens in 2004 after the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service launched an investigation of the wild flora and the U.S. District Court in Tampa found the orchid trader guilty of violating the endangered species act.

Now that's some flower power. This documentary takes a behind the scenes look into the world of collecting, judging, hunting, conservation, and smuggling. It is the story of people's passion, obsession, and the orchids they desire."


Lastly, look forward in May to the POS Member's Caravan Tour with more information to come.
