# Understanding Color in Orchid Flowers


The Palomar Orchid Society is welcoming Harold Koopowitz for a presentation on "Understanding color in orchid flowers." Aside from being a well-known lecturer in the orchid circuit, Harold has been honored by being a recipient of the Herbert Medal from the International Bulb Society; the Orchid Digest Medal for

meritorious service to orchids; the Ralph B. White Medal from the Royal Horticultural Society for innovations in daffodil breeding; the Gold Medal from the American Daffodil Society and the Gold Medal from the American Orchid Society as well as the Westonbirt Medal from the Royal Horticultural Society for outstanding achievement with orchids.

Harold grew up in South Africa where he attended university, majoring in both

Botany and Zoology. He then completed a doctorate at UCLA in California in 1968. A professor at the University of California at Irvine since graduating, he was also the Director of the UCI Arboretum for twenty years. Harold is now Professor Emeritus of Biology in the Department of Ecology and Evolutionary Biology at UCI, where he did research on conservation and ecology.

He is Editor Emeritus for <u>Orchid Digest</u>, which he edited for ten years and still works on the editorial committee of that Journal.

## Caravan to Huntington Orchid Show and Sale

The San Diego County Orchid Society is planning a chartered bus excursion to the Huntington Botanical Garden's Elegant Orchids 2nd Annual International Orchid Show & Sale on Saturday, October 22.

Sundance, a reputable charter bus company, has been selected and they will allow snacks and beverages on-board (no glass bottles/containers). Restroom is on board. They will make a stop in North County at a point TBD, for pick-up. The bus will leave around 8 am and will be return in the evening; approximately 12 hours. Cost is a very reasonable \$40 per person!

This will be a full day trip filled with fun! Attendees will visit the show and allow plenty of time for shopping among the many <u>orchid vendors</u> from around the world. The highlight will include a docent led tour of the three off-exhibit greenhouses, housing over 10,000 orchids. This collection includes the famous S. Robert Weltz Paphiopedium collection. Seventy-two AOS certificates, including five FCCs, have been awarded to plants in the HBG's collection since 2014. Cost for the trip is \$40 per person and admission to the Huntington is free! SDCOS will provide bottled water and snacks for the trip. Lunch options are available at cafes and restaurants on the grounds, or pick a nice spot to enjoy a picnic packed at home.



His most recent orchid book is *Tropical Slipper Orchids* and he is currently working on several new books, including *Topics on Slipper Orchids* and *The Autumn Flowering Daffodils*.


Harold also writes novels and short stories that have orchid themes, <u>Orchid Tales</u> is a compendium of short stories all featuring the characters George and

# General Meeting Information

The Palomar Orchid Society regularly meets the **FIRST WEDNESDAY** of every month at the <u>Pavilion at Lake San Marcos</u> (1105 La Bonita Dr., San Marcos, CA 92078).

Traveling on State Route 78, take the Rancho Santa Fe exit and head South. The entrance to

the Lake San Marcos Resort is on your left about a 1/4 mile South of the San Marcos Blvd. intersection. Traveling on I5 South from Oceanside and North Carlsbad, take the Palomar Airport exit and turn right onto Rancho Santa Fe after about 7 miles. Traveling North on I5 from South Carlsbad and Encinitas, for example, take the La Costa Ave. exit and turn left onto Rancho Santa Fe. The

entrance to the resort will be the first right after the fire station in San Marcos.

Inside the resort at the first "T" intersection, turn left on San Marino Drive. At the next 4-way STOP, turn right on La Bonita Drive. Proceed ahead for one block on La Bonita. The pavilion will be on the left and there is parking in front of the pavilion.

#### The Editor's Corner



One of the characteristics of the orchid family that I personally find very attractive is the immense variety of the plants in this group and their many adaptations to habitats, climate, and pollinators.

A good example are some of the Australian orchids that depend on fire, which Ron Parson talked about last month. Two others are perhaps two of the plants I recently purchased at Andy's Open House: One is a rupiculous Laelia lucasiana with single leaves, each

coming out of a thick pseudobulb. The entire cluster of about 8 growths, including its pot, would have fit comfortably into a pocket of my cargo shorts. The other, a Sobralia dichotoma barely fit into my station wagon on its side. Luckily its 15-odd feet canes are seemingly as sturdy as bamboo and they were easily bent (and unbent again). If I ever manage to get it to bloom, each individual flower will be larger than many of my other, smaller plants, including the Laelia lucasiana, yet they grow in 8" long, branching and many-flowered inflorescences.
