Laelia anceps – the Color Forms and Their Influence on Hybridizing

We are delighted to welcome to our society Curtis Gean of Sierra Vista Orchids, Sanger, CA. He will address the various results when using L. anceps as a parent. Curtis will answer your questions and provide the plant opportunity table with emphasis on the topic of his talk. He

also will have a few plants for sale. As a small quiz, Curtis has included a pic of L. anceps along with two anceps hybrids, Hybrid 1 and Hybrid 2. Attendees should try to figure out what the other parent is, which will be revealed during his talk. Curtis is a shared speaker with SDCOS and will be presenting a talk on 'Hybridizing with Oncidium lecuochilum and Baptistonia echinata' on Tuesday, August 1 in Balboa Park. All are welcome to attend.

Curtis is a semi-retired photographer/videographer that has had a long time interest in orchids. After dabbling in hybrid roses, he was introduced to orchids in 1970 because of his need to use some plants and flowers



in a photo shoot. The gentleman that provided his introduction was Homer C. Dodson, who later became his mentor.

Homer invited Curtis to attend with him a meeting of the local orchid society where he bought some raffle tickets and won two plants. One of those plants, Den. Petite Jewels [Midnight x bigibbum], is still alive and doing well. Needless to say, Curtis was hooked and has had a wonderful time, over the past 46 years, studying species and their cultural requirements, researching hybrids, and even learning to be an orchid judge. He entered the AOS Judges Training Program in 1973 and was elevated to Certified Judge in 1983.

Also, refer to the culture sheets on the various types of orchids that are available to members. We have all seen these sheets, but a refresher always helps.

In 1996, following the break-up of his marriage, Curtis moved to Mexico, where he spent the better part of the next 10 years learning how to survive on next-to nothing. It was a real challenge, but he believes he became a better person as a result of it. In 2007, Curtis returned stateside to care for aging parents, and re-entered the AOS Judging Program. Because of his long absence, Curtis was required to "start over" and was re-certified in 2013.

Orchiditis is a compelling and insidious disease that takes over your life if you let it, and it becomes all-consuming as several of our POS members can attest to. Curtis loves it, and every day he finds something new to explore.

While in Mexico, Curtis had the chance to look for orchids in the states of Nayarit, Jalisco, Colima, Michoacan, and Guerrero. He was able to find numerous epiphytes and semi-terrestrial species, and because of some established contacts there, he was given the opportunity to re-locate many plants slated for destruction. Because of road improvement projects and the like, many plants would have been destroyed, but were able to be re-located to a nearby area and saved as a result of his conservation efforts.



General Meeting Information

The Palomar Orchid Society regularly meets the **FIRST WEDNESDAY** of every month at the <u>Pavilion at Lake San Marcos</u> (1105 La Bonita Dr., San Marcos, CA 92078).

Traveling on State Route 78, take the Rancho Santa Fe exit and head South. The entrance to

the Lake San Marcos Resort is on your left about a 1/4 mile South of the San Marcos Blvd. intersection. Traveling on I5 South from Oceanside and North Carlsbad, take the Palomar Airport exit and turn right onto Rancho Santa Fe after about 7 miles. Traveling North on I5 from South Carlsbad and Encinitas, for example, take the La Costa Ave. exit and turn left onto Rancho Santa Fe. The

entrance to the resort will be the first right after the fire station in San Marcos.

Inside the resort at the first "T" intersection, turn left on San Marino Drive. At the next 4-way STOP, turn right on La Bonita Drive. Proceed ahead for one block on La Bonita. The pavilion will be on the left and there is parking in front of the pavilion.


Judging Sessions


