

She is being jointly hosted by our society and SDCOS and will speak on the same topic in Balboa Park on Tuesday evening. Satomi will talk about the history of the plants, their basic characteristics, how to grow them,

Many flowers are in bud or spike so if you want to prolong the flowering bring these plants inside sooner than later.

Last month Peter Lin of Diamond Orchids gave a very nice presentation on 'Compact Vandaceous Species and Hybrids'. As many of our regular members know, every year we welcome back speakers who typically speak to us annually. Two primary reasons are that they give excellent talks, are knowledgeable orchids experts/judges and they are local (which reduces speaker expenses). In addition, POS is getting new members each year who may not have heard these speakers before.

understand the differences and beauty of these small but magnificent plants.

Fūkiran's popularity is now bigger than ever. Satomi has experience in growing these plants both in Japan and America, she is fluent in both languages and is familiar with both cultures. She has been a judge of Fūkiran events for almost a decade and her goal is to be a bridge to connect both countries and help as many people learn and enjoy growing Fūkiran.

Satomi is the founder of the Fūkiran Society of America, created to promote Fūkiran growing in the United States, Canada and other parts the world. The Fūkiran Society of America is an offshoot of the Japan Fūkiran Society, which is responsible for registering Neofinetia falcata varieties. There are over 250 registered varieties, but if you add unregistered varieties to that, the total is 1000.

# General Meeting Information

The Palomar Orchid Society regularly meets the FIRST WEDNESDAY of every month at the George and Patricia Gowland Meeting Room located in the Carlsbad City Library on Dove Lane, just off El Camino Real in southern Carlsbad. The address is 1775 Dove Lane, Carlsbad, CA 92011.

Traveling South on I-5, take the Poinsettia Ln. exit and travel east to El Camino Real. Turn right on El Camino Real and turn right again on Dove Lane.

If traveling North on I-5, take the La Costa Ave. exit and travel east to El Camino Real. Turn left on Dove Lane (first traffic light after Aviara Pkwy.) Traveling West on S-78, take the San Marcos Blvd. exit and travel west, continuing on Palomar Airport Rd.. Turn left on El Camino Real and then turn right on Dove Lane.

The Dove library will be on your left and there is a large, well-lit parking lot. The Gowland Meeting Room is located on the right hand side of the main entrance.
