Our featured speaker this month is one of our own members, Dr. Phyllis Prestia. Phyllis will talk on the genus *Cycnoches* and will give the hobbyist orchid grower a thorough review of the distinctive traits of these spectacular orchids. She will highlight the key species most popular in modern *Cycnoches* breeding and their influence of color and form in both primary and complex hybrids.

Phyllis' comprehensive review of the culture for these relatively easy to grow orchids, including tips from her own successful experiences in growing them, will allow even those new to the genus to grow, bloom and enjoy these beautiful, fragrant orchids.

The opportunity table will be provided by Sunset Valley Orchids and will likely include some cycnoches hybrid seedlings.

Phyllis S. Prestia, Ed.D. is a retired educator and Middle School Principal, who received a Doctorate of Education at Rutgers University, where she also served as

Originally from New Jersey, she moved to California with her husband to retire in the sunny, San Diego area and grow orchids. Her collection includes a variety of species and hybrids across several genera grown both in a small greenhouse and three outdoor growing areas under shade cloth.

In her orchid life, Phyllis has been the President of the San Diego County Cymbidium Society and currently serves as the Vice President of the Cymbidium Society of America, as well as keeping active in several Southern California orchid so-

General Meeting Information

The Palomar Orchid Society regularly meets the FIRST WEDNESDAY of every month at the Pavilion at Lake San Marcos (1105 La Bonita Dr., San Marcos, CA 92078).

Traveling on State Route 78, take the Rancho Santa Fe exit and head South. The entrance to

the Lake San Marcos Resort is on your left about a 1/4 mile South of the San Marcos Blvd. intersection. Traveling on I5 South from Oceanside and North Carlsbad, take the Palomar Airport exit and turn right onto Rancho Santa Fe after about 7 miles. Traveling North on I5 from South Carlsbad and Encinitas, for example, take the La Costa Ave. exit and turn left onto Rancho Santa Fe. The entrance to the resort will be the first right after the fire station in San Marcos.

Inside the resort at the first "T" intersection, turn left on San Marino Drive. At the next 4way STOP, turn right on La Bonita Drive. Proceed ahead for one block on La Bonita. The pavilion will be on the left and there is parking in front of the pavilion.

The Editor's Corner



As soon as this months POS News is done, I will start packing for a short camping trip to Santa Catalina island. The sleeping bags are already rolled up, the fishing poles and snorkeling equipment are cleaned up and ready, and the kids are rearing to go.

Curious, as to whether I must leave orchids behind for almost an entire week (don't we all worry about that??), I did a quick search and it turns out, I don't actually have to: Santa Catalina island is home to at least two species

of orchids, *Piperia unalascensis*, the Rein orchid, and *Epipactis gigantea*, the stream orchid. Both occur throughout California and the former even carried the name "Santa Catalina Rein Orchid" for a while as it was subjected to various name changes and re-classifications. *Epipactis gigantea*, on the other hand, was apparently never officially documented on the island until 2011.

We are at the very end of the blooming season for both and given the dry conditions, it is very likely I will not get to see either of them in the wild. If I do, you will definitely hear me brag about it at the September meeting though.
