## A Virtual Tour of the Huntington Library's Orchid Collection

We are delighted to welcome back our friend Brandon Tam, Orchid Collection Specialist at the Huntington Library, who will take us through a virtual tour of The Huntington's Orchid Collection. As the Orchid Collection Specialist, Brandon curates one of the largest and most diverse orchid species collections in the world, including over 1500 unique species and 3,600 different varieties across 280 orchid genera. He oversees day-to-day horticultural operations, including acquisitions, propagation, conservation, and supervision of over 40 orchid volunteers. Under Brandon's stewardship, The Huntington has won over 100 awards from the American Orchid Society. He supervises numerous public education events, such as orchid shows, orchid judgings, and

conferences. Additionally, Brandon cocurates the *Amorphophallus titanum* (corpse flower) collection of 43 mature specimens and has exhibited over ten blooming specimens. Brandon started as the Orchid Collection Specialist at The Huntington at age 16 while concurrently earning his bachelor's degree in plant science from California State Polytechnic University at Pomona, which he completed in 2015. Brandon is an extremely

The Huntington houses a vast, outstanding orchid collection that Brandon is responsible for as Orchid Collection Specialist. For March, we are planning a Culture Class that is different from previous ones. Jerry Spencer and Ken Campbell will be the speakers. Details on their talks will be described in the March Newsletter, but plan on coming as Jerry and Ken are two of our more accomplished POS orchid hobbyists. Both give excellent presentations that are insightful and enjoyed by our members.

We are pleased that many of our members renewed their annual membership at the January meeting. If you have not yet renewed or are a visitor, we encourage you to renew/sign up at the next meeting.

With all this wet weather, we have not had to water our orchid collections. which saves us water and time. Please be on the lookout for bacterial and fungal rot that must be treated before it damages your plants. Also be on the watch for snails that proliferate during these wet conditions. They can quickly damage new growth and flowers. It's also a good time to begin repotting/dividing your cymbidium orchids that have finished blooming and to take the time to cull your collections. All of us have plants that are in poor health and we suggest discarding them and making more room on your bench for new, healthy plants available from the upcoming spring orchid shows and sales events. Culling is one of the many recommendations that Fred Clarke of SVO has made during several of his presentations.



If you have a healthy plant that has not bloomed for you, consider giving it to a fellow member who may have more favorable growing conditions for that type of orchid.



The address is <u>1775 Dove Lane</u>, <u>Carlsbad, CA 92011</u>. Traveling South on I-5, take the Poinsettia Ln. exit and travel east to El Camino Real. Turn right on El Camino Real and turn right again on Dove Lane.

If traveling North on I-5, take the La Costa Ave. exit and travel east to El Camino Real. Turn left on Dove Lane (first traffic light after Aviara Pkwy.) Traveling West on S-78, take the San Marcos Blvd. exit and travel west, continuing on Palomar Airport Rd.. Turn left on El Camino Real and then turn right on Dove Lane.

The Dove library will be on your left and there is a large, well-lit parking lot. The Gowland Meeting Room is located on the right hand side of the main entrance.


