# *Neofinetia falcata* and its Hybrids

## Peter Lin

We are pleased to welcome back Peter Lin as our speaker for February. Peter will present the topic 'Neofinetia falcata and its Hybrids', which will feature this Japanese native orchid species, a bit of history, the many forms and varieties, and a selection

of its hybrids within the Vanda alliance. He also will describe how to grow these marvelous temperature tolerant orchids.

Neofinetia falcata is native to Japan and has been grown there for centuries. They are highly treasured and come in many flower forms and leaf forms. It has been used with other vandaceous genera to produce charming compact hybrids.

Peter started growing orchids over 25 years ago, but then stopped due to school and starting a career. It wasn't until about 9 years ago that the orchid "bug" came back and he is now heavily involved once again. He is an accredited judge with the American Orchid Society and a hybrid-

often be found at various orchid shows and societies around the country. He also has thousands of photos of his orchids that he maintains on <u>Flickr</u>.



#### President's Message

Many thanks to all that participated in January's member survey. We received excellent feedback that has provided our board with good ideas and suggestions for improvements as we develop our programs for 2013. Some will be implemented at our February meeting. These include streamlining our meetings to make them more efficient and shorter so members can get home at a reasonable time. Accordingly, our meeting will start promptly at 6:30 pm with business, followed by the speaker, who will incorporate cultural information in his talk rather than having it as a separate session. The talk will be followed by an abbreviated Show-n-Tell given by Merle, who will highlight select plants brought in by members. The break will commence and members who brought in plants will be asked to spend some time with their plants so interested parties can ask specific questions. After the break, we'll have the opportunity table, which should conclude by 9 pm at the latest.

Several members expressed interest in gaining more info on orchid basics so we have instituted in the newsletter a "Monthly To Do" list compiled by our experienced members along with some links to info on the



American Orchid Society website as well as select links on culture and repotting. In addition, we will set aside a couple of monthly meetings per year where we bring together a panel of advanced growers to speak on various aspects of orchid culture and to answer questions that members may have. Members may also bring in their problem plants for diagnosis. Our first session is planned for March, which is a perfect time to review cultural aspects for the upcoming growing season.

At our January board meeting, we also discussed the potential of moving our meetings to Lake San Marcos in view of the increasing rent at the Carlsbad Women's Club. Aside from cost, the LSM facility offers several attractive advantages as described in the accompanying article listing both pros and cons. The majority of board members support this change and would like to solicit your input on the matter. Accordingly, there will be a vote at the Feb. meeting and by email/internet for those who cannot attend the meeting. The move would not take place until the July meeting, but everything must be in place well in advance should we decide to relocate. Please review the pros and cons prior to making your recommendation.

Cher Whelan and Sandi Sandquist are working on some ideas for future caravan activities for presentation at the February meeting. Our board is dedicated to providing fun and educational activities for our membership. Please do not hesitate to participate and get involved. We readily welcome your suggestions, ideas and criticisms in order to make POS a better organization.

In closing, do not miss this month's talk by Peter Lin on "Neofinetia falcata and its Hybrids". Peter is an excellent, very knowledgeable speaker and a good friend of POS. You definitely will learn much from him about this fascinating, easy to grow species from Japan.

# Survey Results

With a participation of 39 members and friends of the Palomar Orchid Society, the survey results have given the POS directors valuable feedback in regard to the different activities of the society. Following is a brief summary of the survey results, which are available in full at palomarorchid.org/2013surveyresults.

Most respondents are regular attendees of our monthly meetings and while each part of the meeting was generally well liked, a majority thought that the meetings are too long. Specifically, the responses indicated that this could be improved upon by starting meetings on time, keeping to an agenda, and for the main presentation to be a bit shorter.

One of the favorite aspects of the monthly meeting seems to be the Opportunity Table, closely followed by the main presentation, and the Show and Tell. Many respondents also indicated an interest in the culture class, particularly when it is providing more basic orchid information for beginning growers.

The speaker selection for last year received a very high rating and responses to this section of the survey included several valuable suggestions for future topics and presenters.

Feedback on the monthly newsletter and the website was generally very positive

and included suggestions for additional topics. For example, it was suggested to provide a monthly "To Do" checklist on orchid culture.

The POS Board of Directors discussed all survey responses in detail at a meeting on January 9, 2013. It was decided to focus on keeping future meetings on time by adopting the suggestions provided by the survey responses. Meetings will begin promptly at 6:30 pm and speakers will be



encouraged to keep their presentations to 45 minutes in length. Time for questions may be adjusted based on the length of the main talk. Speakers will be asked to emphasize culture aspects in their talks, while culture classes will be held more infrequently this year but will be the main focus of those occasions instead. For example, the March meeting will feature a panel of experienced orchid growers and POS members available to answer any and all culture-related questions from the membership.

One of the more important issues addressed in the survey was the possible relocation of the monthly meetings to a different location, provided that that location would offer a significant cost savings and an easier set-up and cleanup. A little more than two-thirds of the respondents favored such a change, 7 out of 37 were opposed and 5 abstained. The POS Board voted in favor of proposing to adopt the Pavilion in Lake San Marcos as our new meeting venue and putting this question to a vote by the membership at the February meeting as described in more detail in the accompanying newsletter column.

# Vote on Relocating Future POS Meetings to Lake San Marcos

As mentioned in the President's Message, the Board is soliciting your vote on the relocation of our meetings to Lake San Marcos (<u>Lake Pavilion</u>, <u>1105 La Bonita Drive</u>, <u>San Marcos</u>, <u>CA 92078</u>) beginning with the July 3 meeting.

This is the same facility where we conducted our auction last August and will also have it again this year on August 3. Two of the most important advantages of this move include a significant decrease in the monthly rent (from \$250 to \$50 per month) and the set up and take down of

the tables and chairs, which should make life much easier for all of us and further expedite our meetings. A more detailed assessment of the pros and cons are listed below. You will be able to vote by ballot at the February meeting or by email sent out after the meeting for those of you who are not able to attend the meeting. #### **Pros**

1) The relocation would result in a substantial cost saving of \$2000 per year in rent fees for our monthly meetings. This would allow POS to maintain ex-



- isting low membership fees and use saved funds to support mailings of newsletter to some members, pay for meeting drinks and supplies, and support other educational activities.
- Lake San Marcos staff will set up and take down chairs and tables and provides audio and visual equipment for our use.
- The Pavilion facility is available to POS at the current dates and times of our monthly meetings.
- 4) The facility and adjacent parking lots are lit at night, has ample parking, and is accessible to the handicapped.
- 5) The meeting room is large and is airconditioned for hot evenings and there is a kitchen area for setting out snacks and drinks.
- 6) LSM has a security company that patrols all homes around LSM 24/7, with recreational facilities patrolled starting at 10:00 pm.
- 7) Meetings at the Pavilion could attract new members from the San Marcos/ Escondido area.

#### Cons

 The proposed location is not as conveniently located for some members as the Carlsbad Women's Club and we might lose some members who would have to drive further.



- 2) There is currently no storage space for POS supplies.
- 3) The restrooms are outside and unlocked, but near to the meeting room entrances. There is only a single key for the women's restroom but Maryanne is looking into the possibility of getting a second key.

# February To Do List

## General

- Clean growing area, remove dead leaves, and discard dying plants. Wet and cold serve as prime conditions for fungus and rots. Institute prophylactic interventions to avoid diseases: clean non-growing surfaces with 5% Clorox or Physan, space orchids, and provide adequate air circulation.
- Keep watch for pests (mealy bugs, scale, snails, slugs) and treat before they spread to rest of collection
- Monitor outdoor tempartures, below 50 for cool growing orchids, below 65 for warm growing orchids, and below 60 for intermediate growing. If necessary, protect sensitive plants

by covering or providing some form of shielding from elements.

Identify plants to be repotted (overgrown or media broken down) and watch for signs of new root growth before repotting.

# Indoors and Greenhouse

- Watch for phaleanopsis spikes and stake while spikes are still flexible. More information is available at www.themulch.com
- Water regularly but fertilize sparingly until plants show signs of new growth.

#### Outdoors

Maintain plants on dry side and withhold or limit fertilizer until weather improves and plants show signs of new growth. Bud drop in spring on paphs and phals is primarily due to root loss from over watering in winter.

# Cymbidiums

- Continue regular fertilizer regimen for cymbidiums during this period.
- Stake cymbidium flower spikes and repot overgrown cymbidiums when finished blooming. Links to repotting and care: www.orquideas.com, and www.themulch.com.
- Most cymbidiums can tolerate tempartures in the 20's for short periods.
- Be sure to give them plenty of sunlight during winter months.
