# David Brown

### A Year at the San Diego Zoo Orchid Greenhouse

This month we welcome David Brown as our guest speaker. David's presentation will highlight those plants that typically flower in each month.

The greenhouse at the San Diego Zoo is open to the public every third Friday of the month as part of the zoo's "Orchid"

Odyssey". David first attended that event in 1999, and became fascinated with the orchids in the zoo's collection. "There was so much diversity in shape, size, color and form." he remembers. David came to see the greenhouse as one of the hidden jewel of the zoo and he returned every month after that. Eventually, he met Janette Gerrity, who is in charge of the orchid collection at the zoo. Janette began to mentor him in his new orchid obsession and David also came to know the volunteers who worked there and who shared their information and knowledge with him. After a few years, he knew enough about the orchid collection to become a volunteer himself. Upon a suggestion by other volunteers, he began to attend the meetings of the San Diego





County Orchid Society and soon became an active member, later serving as a member of the board and, eventually, as President.

The orchid collection at the Zoo consists of about 3000 plants in 300 genera and 800 species. David especially favors the large species collection: "As pretty and intriguing as hybrids are, there is just something about species," he said. During his talk, he will share some of the zoo's "impressive plants."



## General Meeting Information

The Palomar Orchid Society regularly meets the **FIRST WEDNESDAY** of every month at the <u>Pavilion at Lake San Marcos</u> (1105 La Bonita Dr., San Marcos, CA 92078).

Traveling on State Route 78, take the Rancho Santa Fe exit and head South. The entrance to

the Lake San Marcos Resort is on your left about a 1/4 mile South of the San Marcos Blvd. intersection. Traveling on I5 South from Oceanside and North Carlsbad, take the Palomar Airport exit and turn right onto Rancho Santa Fe after about 7 miles. Traveling North on I5 from South Carlsbad and Encinitas, for example, take the La Costa Ave. exit and turn left onto Rancho Santa Fe. The entrance to the

resort will be the first right after the fire station in San Marcos.

Inside the resort at the first "T" intersection, turn left on San Marino Drive. At the next 4-way STOP, turn right on La Bonita Drive. Proceed ahead for one block on La Bonita. The pavilion will be on the left and there is parking in front of the pavilion.

#### The Editor's Corner



Happy Summer! With the marine layer burning off faster now and temperatures climbing, don't forget to keep an eye out for sunburn. SPF30 for you, maybe a move or some shade cloth for your orchids! Keep in mind, when you move your plants to a shadier spot, they may need a little less water. Conversely, if you leave them where they are, you might want to increase watering.

Along with my orchids, various weeds seem to have been enjoying some growth spurts as well. A particular

nuisance is the commonly called "clover", which is most likely a species from the genus Oxalis or "wood-sorrel." While their leaves are edible with a sour, citrusy taste (oxalic acid, often used in metal cleansers, was first isolated from these plants), they don't do much good for our orchids. On the contrary, their roots will eventually fill the pot, compete with orchid roots for nutrients, and quickly create a much too wet substrate. I found them hard to get rid of but I have heard that some had good luck brushing their leaves (very carefully!!) with RoundUp using a fine paint brush as an applicator.
