Culture Class Panel

Lisa Humphreys, Merle Robboy, Jerry Spencer, and Helge Weissig

Our great society has had an influx of new members over the past year and many of them have asked for a culture class session. Our senior members are more than willing to answer any questions and for the March meeting we will have a panel session with four of our more experienced members answering questions related to orchid culture. Members on the panel are Lisa Humphreys, Merle Robboy, Jerry Spencer, and Helge Weissig. Please write down any questions you might have and bring them to the March meeting. The more questions we have, the more informative this session will be. As the saying goes: "There are no dumb questions in this world, never be afraid to ask".

Lisa Humphreys is co-owner of Lico Orchids & Flowers and has been growing orchids since 1994, with an emphasis on species. She has been active in the orchid business since 1995, primarily selling hybrid orchids to florists. Lico Orchids specializes in orchids that are easy to grow and have long-lasting blooms.

Merle Robboy, MD, is a long-time member of our society with much experience in growing many plants of the orchid family. Dr. Robboy regularly presents all of the blooming flowers brought in by our members in the monthly "show and tell" sessions. His encyclopedic knowledge of most all of the plants and his detailed explanation of



their geographical origin, culture needs, and genetic background make these sessions a favorite part of the meetings for many.

Jerry Spencer, together with his wife Anita, cultivate a vast collection of thousands of orchids and many years of experience growing them. We visited their greenhouses in 2016 during one of our caravans and learned much about orchid cultivation on a scale. Jerry has a very scientific approach to raising orchids. While we were there, he was running an experiment to find out which solution would hold a certain spray chemical in suspension the longest. In three different containers he was testing alcohol, vodka and water. Jerry combines a wealth of knowledge, a great personality, and an enormous curiosity with a wonderful sense of humor.

Helge Weissig, PhD, produces the monthly POS newsletter and maintains both website and email services for our society. Helge has been growing and photographing orchids for about 10 years and most of the pictures in the newsletter

PRESIDENTS' MESSAGE

As we write this newsletter, we are quickly approaching spring, which officially begins on March 20. As with last month's message, the rains have continued and are helping relieve California's drought conditions. It also means we are continuing to save time, money and water for our precious orchids.

We have noticed an increase in the number of snails and slugs in our garden so be on the alert for these pests in your orchid collections. This is particularly true for those of us with outdoor collections. There are many readily available products on the market to control snails and slugs. Ask your fellow members what they use and what is effective for them. Note that such products containing metaldehyde are quite toxic to dogs so select products that are pet safe if you have them.

Fred Clarke of Sunset Valley Orchids gave us a wonderful talk in February entitled 'The Modern Cattleya'. This is the first time we have heard this talk and Fred had excellent slides of his beautiful cattleyas. In addition, he gave us a number of tips on *cattleya orchid culture. This was a nice* preview to our March meeting, where our expert panel will address your questions and concerns on any culture related topics. As an additional note, don't rely on this meeting to answer all your questions. Take the time at our regular meetings to talk with others about your questions and concerns. Our expert members are more than willing to share information with you.

During our last meeting there were several side conversations with fellow members during the speaker's talk. This is not only disrespectful to the speaker but also to fellow members who are trying to listen to the talk so please refrain from side conversations during the presentation, but do ask questions of the speaker during the meeting and with colleagues during the break as a courtesy to our speakers and other members. We have finalized plans for our April speaker who will be George Hatfield, current president of AOS and a well-known and recognized grower of award winning cymbidiums. George will speak on pendulous cymbidiums and will provide the plant table as well.

In May, there will be no monthly meeting because that is the month of the POS Annual Orchid Auction. Our auction is scheduled for May 6, so please mark that date on your calendar to help support this important fundraiser. We need a number of people to serve in different capacities and they are all important roles. As most of you know, this is the primary fundraiser for POS that enables us to fund excellent speakers, both local and from out of the area. It also helps pay for the plant tables and other events, such as caravans, plants for holiday dinner, etc.

Regarding the upcoming auction, please look at your collections for duplicate plants you can donate to the auction. Regularly dividing plants is a good way to increase your collection and provide divisions to share with friends and the society. March and April will be an opportune time to divide plants as they should be initiating new root growth. 

General Meeting Information




Traveling on State Route 78, take the Rancho Santa Fe exit and head South. The entrance to

the Lake San Marcos Resort is on your left about a 1/4 mile South of the San Marcos Blvd. intersection. Traveling on I5 South from Oceanside and North Carlsbad, take the Palomar Airport exit and turn right onto Rancho Santa Fe after about 7 miles. Traveling North on I5 from South Carlsbad and Encinitas, for example, take the La Costa Ave. exit and turn left onto Rancho Santa Fe. The

entrance to the resort will be the first right after the fire station in San Marcos.

Inside the resort at the first "T" intersection, turn left on San Marino Drive. At the next 4-way STOP, turn right on La Bonita Drive. Proceed ahead for one block on La Bonita. The pavilion will be on the left and there is parking in front of the pavilion.

The Editor's Corner



Rain, rain, go away! Who would have thought that we would be saying this this year and winter isn't even officially over yet!? If you are growing your plants like I do, only protected by trees or shade cloth, your pots are probably as soaked as mine are and had nary a time in between to dry out. On top of it, weeds are growing everywhere and slugs are having a field day already.

It's very much time to get busy! While there isn't much to be done about the wetness, keep an eye on your plants

for any signs of water stress. Pull those weeds early before the grow seeds and set up snail traps or use appropriate pest control methods (iron phosphate is my favorite go-to here, since it is relatively harmless to other animals).

The nuisances of the very rainy winter aside, it is a tremendous relief to be finally out of the drought and the green hills everywhere are visually simply stunning!
