Zygos for Southern California

Our society welcomes back Tim Culbertson who will talk about development of new Zygopetalum hybrids. Tim is an excellent speaker and orchid enthusiast who will illustrate new directions in Hawaii and in the US to make temperature-tolerant miniature Zygos. These

plants are easy to grow and flower, are vigorous, and have low cultural demands; many will grow easily outdoors in Southern California. Although many Zygos look similar, different breeding lines from around the world have pushed the look of Zygos in radical and wild directions. Many genera contribute to these new hybrids, and Tim will share will some of these with you, as well as help identify some of the important parents in the backgrounds of new and modern colors and appearances found in this genus. will have a new appreciation of what goes into breeding trends for these types of plants, as well as an appreciation of their beautiful flowers and ease-of-growth, both indoors and outside. PRESIDENTS' MESSAGE

Happy Spring to all POS members and Friends,

As we approach Spring, it is one of the best seasons for orchid lovers. Many varieties of orchids are in bloom, including Cymbidiums, Zygos, Dendrobiums, Cattleyas and many others. We get to enjoy the fruits of our labors. All the hard work, repotting, fertilizing, pest control, etc. finally pays off. This has been especially important during COVID with the cancellations of orchid shows, open houses and society meetings. Hopefully, we are at the end of the tunnel and 2022 will be more normal as the year progresses.

Last month we held an in-person meeting again and it was well attended, considering the lingering concerns. About 20 people enjoyed the culture presentation by Alex Nadzan and Jerry Spencer. Thanks to both of our expert growers for sharing the tips for successful orchid growing and cymbidium repotting. Our goal is to continue live meetings as long as they are safe. The city still requires masks for indoor meetings so this requirement will remain until further notice. Our members overwhelmingly prefer these in-person meetings to Zoom so we will strive to accomplish that. Meetings will require masks and vaccinated audiences. This month POS will provide refreshments and water but we urge attendees to wear their masks when not eating or drinking.

In January, for the first time, we were able to guarantee every opportunity table ticket purchaser an orchid and we will do this again in March. This is a bonus for member comfortable with coming to our meetings. We also want to apologize for the problems we experienced with the Zoom link for the meeting. Several of you were not able to log into the meeting because the previous month's link was sent in the newsletter email. From now on, we will be using a reoccurring Zoom meeting link that will be used for the March and subsequent meetings that will correct the problem

ty. Sometimes there are last minute cancellations or changes after we publish the POS Newsletter, so be sure to consult the individual events websites before heading out.

SDCOS will be hosting their Spring Orchid Show at the Scottish Rite Events Center on March 18-20 so please plan to attend and support the vendors and our sister society. POS will have a display booth this year and we will be contacting those who volunteered to discuss their involvement and encourage members to enter their plants in our display or in the show for ribbon judging. Please see the accompanying article regarding the show and submission of plants for the display and show. In addition to the commercial vendor sales, several society members will be selling their own plants at the show as well as the orchid conservation group.

This past year we have added new members despite COVID. Many of our newer members are anxious to learn more about growing orchids and interacting with more experienced members. We also have lost some long-time members for various reasons, but we welcome all visitors and members at our meetings.

Please plan to renew your POS Membership early or join if you have not already done so. These fees are minimal but are important and help cover the speaker fees, opportunity tables, meeting room costs and other operating expenses. Mail renewals to POS, P.O. Please refer to the POS website or AOS website for orchid culture tips for this time of the year. One important piece of information is to plan and purchase your supplies before repotting, fertilizing, etc. You

don't want to be running around finding supplies in the middle of repotting. When repotting be sure to have on hand a variety of pot sizes, because you can't predict if you will be dividing or upsizing the pot. Be sure to keep on hand various sizes of orchid bark including small, medium and large. During the pandemic, there has been limited availability of imported orchid bark. Also be sure to find a primary source of supplies, whether a local store or on-line retailer. Since few of the big box stores carry a good selection of orchid pots, identify a source and stock up. Consider sharing bags of bark with a friend to minimize storage space, etc. An updated handout on Orchid Repotting Basics by Alex Nadzan is available for downloading from our website that lists on-line and local sources of orchid supplies, under the pulldown for Meetings and Speaker Handouts.

General Meeting Information

The Palomar Orchid Society regularly meets the FIRST WEDNESDAY of every month at the George and Patricia Gowland Meeting Room located in the Carlsbad City Library on Dove Lane, just off El Camino Real in southern Carlsbad. The address is 1775 Dove Lane, Carlsbad, CA 92011.

Traveling South on I-5, take the Poinsettia Ln. exit and travel east to El Camino Real. Turn right on El Camino Real and turn right again on Dove Lane.

If traveling North on I-5, take the La Costa Ave. exit and travel east to El Camino Real. Turn left on Dove Lane (first traffic light after Aviara Pkwy.) Traveling West on S-78, take the San Marcos Blvd. exit and travel west, continuing on Palomar Airport Rd.. Turn left on El Camino Real and then turn right on Dove Lane.

The Dove library will be on your left and there is a large, well-lit parking lot. The Gowland Meeting Room is located on the right hand side of the main entrance.


