For May, we welcome back Carlos Lopez of Sunset Valley Orchid. Carlos will speak on 'The Hidden Life of Catasetinae'. Carlos has spoken to POS on two previous occasions and always provides an interesting lecture. Carlos also will provide the Plant Opportunity Table this month with SVO orchids. SVO supports POS throughout the year and having Fred or Carlos speak to us is one of our ways of reciprocating.

As previously announced, the San Diego Botanic Garden will be hosting its annual World of Orchids Show from May 4th through May 27th. If you have not yet been to this show, try to see the outstanding orchid display in its Conservatory. It is unlike any orchid display in Southern California. POS and SDCOS support this show by providing blooming orchids for the display throughout the show.

Orchid and plant vendors will be selling on the weekends of the show and POS will be holding a fundraising sale on the weekend of May 25, 26 and 27. It is one of two fundraisers POS has and is critical to support our society's activities. If you have not already signed up, we would like you to sign up at the May meeting to volunteer and provide plant donations for the sale. We encourage everyone to participate because it is a rewarding experience, supports our society and gives you an opportunity to see the display while you are volunteering (at no cost). IMPORTANT ANNOUNCEMENT!!!!!!

At the April meeting we announced that **effective July 1**, the Carlsbad Library changed its operating hours and will no longer allow meetings after 7 PM. Therefore, POS needs to change it meeting hours or change locations. June 2024 will be our last meeting at the Dove Library from 6:30 p.m. to 9:30 p.m. **Beginning July 3rd**, **our meeting time will change to 4 p.m. to 7 p.m. at the same Gowland Room that we currently meet in. This change will be for the remainder of 2024 until modified**.

We made this change to guarantee that we had a meeting location. This may be a temporary change, or it may be a permanent change. The POS Board is open to exploring other venues that meet our budget and other criteria. This includes a facility that costs less than \$40 per hour, is safe, has ample parking and centrally located to our core membership and capable of being reserved 11 or 12 months a year. We need a facility that we can rent on Wednesdays, since POS shares speakers with SDCOS several times a year. Ideally, we seek a facility that provides set up and take down of the chairs and tables, and audio-visual equipment. The POS Board will carefully review all viable options.

We asked members to submit suggestions (and to vet them beforehand) to Bill directly. We recognize that the new meeting time may prevent some of our working members from attending meetings so we are exploring agenda changes that will move the speaker's presentation to the latter portion of the meeting, perhaps 5:30 p.m. to 6:45 p.m. We recognize that this is not a perfect situation, but we will have to work with this change until a better solution is found. We thank all our members for their understanding and cooperation during this transition.

We hope our members and friends remain healthy, upbeat and optimistic about the future. As always, Bill and Alex are available to listen to your suggestions, questions and concerns. World of Orchids Show at the San Diego Botanic Garden

The World of Orchids Show will be held between May 4 and May 27 at the San Diego Botanic Garden.

As highlighted in last month's newsletter, members of POS and SDCOS will have the opportunity to display society plants during this year's show which is open from Wed- Mon. during the four weeks of the show. By now, participants that have signed up to loan plants during the month of the show should have received an email from Debby Halliday to submit the names of the plants for the first delivery of plants on May 1. If not, please contact contact Debby Halliday by <u>email</u> to be added to the list. Remember you do not have to display plants every week during the show. Forms are sent out on a weekly basis and plants will be dropped off and picked up on successive Tuesdays (May 7, 14, and 21) with pick up at the end of the show on May 28. When you bring in your plants, you will be given a number for each plant and a label, made up by the garden. You tag your plants and hand them off to the garden crew for placement in the display.

Your plants will remain on display and be cared for by Garden staff until the flowers start to fade. Debby Halliday or Alex Nadzan will look at the plants every Monday and pull out those that need to go home. You will be sent a pick-up list and you can get your plants on the next drop-off day. The others will remain for as long as they look nice and will be watered by the garden staff should they need it. We keep a careful inventory of the plants in the show and make sure you get everything back at the end.

Participating in this event is a lot of fun and gives our societies the opportunity to show visitors many of the beautiful orchid hybrids and species we grow to perfection. As a thank you, the Garden gives all participants a free annual family membership.

Requirements for your display plants: 1) Clean and bug free we don't want to introduce pests into the SDBG conservatory. 2) Clean pot, but no outer pot is necessary. 3) Clearly labeled with plant name and your name. 4) Recently watered.

On weekends, show visitors can shop for unusual and unique orchids at the Orchid Marketplace. During the show SDCOS members will be selling orchids the weekends of May 4-5 and 17-19, with the Orchid Conservation Alliance selling on May 11-12 and POS selling plants for their society's fundraiser on the weekend of May 25-27 (Sat. through Monday, Labor Day). Additionally, other vendors will be selling from 10-5 every Sat. and Sun. and a few on select Fridays. Please refer to the <u>SDBG website</u> for more details on vendors, classes and general admission.

Admission to World of Orchids is included with the Garden entrance fee or Garden membership. All attendees are encouraged to make a reservation online to obtain tickets for entry. Entrance is free for AOS members but you still need to register for tickets (under reciprocal) and show your ticket and AOS membership card upon entry. Make your reservation today for this exciting, month's long show.

The Palomar Orchid Society regularly meets the FIRST WEDNESDAY of every month at the George and Patricia Gowland Meeting Room located in the Carlsbad City Library on Dove Lane, just off El Camino Real in southern Carlsbad. The address is 1775 Dove Lane, Carlsbad, CA 92011.

Traveling South on I-5, take the Poinsettia Ln. Traveling West on S-78, take the San Marcos exit and travel east to El Camino Real. Turn Blvd. exit and travel west, continuing on right on El Camino Real and turn right again Palomar Airport Rd.. Turn left on El Camino on Dove Lane.

Ave. exit and travel east to El Camino Real. Turn left on Dove Lane (first traffic light after Aviara Pkwy.)

Real and then turn right on Dove Lane.
