Monthly Meeting Wednesday May 7, 2025 4:00 PM

May Speaker – TJ Hartung "Fragrant Orchids



It is our pleasure to welcome to our society for the first time TJ Hartung, who will speak to our society on "Fragrant Orchids". TJ is a shared speaker with SDCOS and he will be speaking on Tuesday evening, May 6 on "Vanilla Orchids" in Balboa Park. His presentation will be streamed on Zoom for those members who are unable to attend in person. Contact Alex Nadzan for the SDCOS Zoom link if you'd like to participate on Zoom.

TJ is a retired computer systems specialist and systems analyst who designed computers and wrote computer software to manage hotels. His love for orchids began when he lived in Southern California and started growing Cymbidiums in his yard. For quite a few years, every secretary in the company where he worked received, anonymously, a Cymbidium blossom on Valentine's Day.

Since retiring to Mexico, TJ has been rescuing orchids from downed trees and broken limbs before they are eaten by animals or washed down the streams and rivers into the sea. Much of what he knows about orchids he has learned in the laboratory of the great outdoors. The rest comes from online research and numerous books on the subject. He is on the Board of Directors of the Vallarta Botanical Garden, which is a 79 acre botanical garden near Puerto Vallarta, Mexico, of which 73 acres are dedicated as a reserve.

Over 10% of all orchids are known to have a fragrance, some good, some not. This talk covers the how and why of orchid fragrances, and a fascinating list of the various scents found in orchids and is based on his book 'Stop and Smell the Orchids'

In recent years he has given talks to orchid societies in the US, Canada, England and Scotland. He has written two books: "Vanilla – The Gift from Mexico that gives Flavor and Aroma to the World" and "Stop and Smell the Orchids" plus a number of articles for "Orchids" magazine.

To All POS Members and Friends,

Spring has definitely sprung with the flowering of many of our orchids including cymbidiums, cattleyas, Aussie dendrobiums and others. Now is the time to start the spring repotting and dividing season with the new growth of our orchids. Be sure to take advantage of emergence of new roots with green tips to repot as it will minimize the stress of the plant and give them a good start to produce new pseudobulbs during the growing season. Please refer to the handout on our website for details on repotting basics if you didn't have a chance to attend our Culture Meeting on "Repotting and Dividing Your Orchids" in March.



Last month, we were scheduled to have our good friend Arnold Gum give a talk on his trip to Colombia but Alex unfortunately learned the morning of the talk that Arnie passed away the previous evening of a heart attack, which was a big shock and huge loss of a personal friend and a major loss to the orchid community. Arnie was a wonderful, positive soul, an extremely knowledgeable orchid grower, a strong contributor to our local orchid community and a valued AOS judge. Over the years, Arnie gave POS several informative talks to our society and he will be dearly missed by us and the entire orchid community. Since it was a last-minute situation, we decided to hold our meeting and we played an AOS webinar on the "Orchids of Colombia" by Ron Parsons that covered the much of the same topic that Arnie was to give. Andy's Orchids provided us a

nice plant table consisting of mostly Colombian orchids to complement Arnie's planned talk. All in all, it was a successful meeting in spite of the sad situation.

SDCOS conducted their Spring Show in Balboa Park over Easter weekend, April 18-20. Several of our joint POS/SDCOS members participated and four of our members won Best of Sections: Ana Seitz, Suzi Sandore, Alex Nadzan, and Anita and Jerry Spencer who also won the Best of Show and the Forest Robinson Culture awards for their wonderful Ctt. Blazing Treat. Pics are shown below in this newsletter.

This month we host a new, shared speaker with SDCOS, TJ Hartung, who will speak to us about "Fragrant Orchids" on Wednesday afternoon May 7th in the Carlsbad Dove Library. TJ will be speaking on Tuesday evening, May 6 in Balboa Park on "Vanilla Orchids" for those individuals who want to attend his talk on that topic. General Meeting Information

The Palomar Orchid Society regularly meets the FIRST WEDNESDAY of every month, at 4:00 PM, at the George and Patricia Gowland Meeting Room located in the Carlsbad City Library on Dove Lane, just off El Camino Real in southern Carlsbad. The address is 1775 Dove Lane, Carlsbad, CA 92011.

Traveling South on I-5, take the Poinsettia Ln. Traveling West on S-78, take the San Marcos right on El Camino Real and turn right again Palomar Airport Rd.. Turn left on El Camino on Dove Lane.

Ave. exit and travel east to El Camino Real. is a large, well-lit parking lot. The Gowland Turn left on Dove Lane (first traffic light after Meeting Room is located on the right hand Aviara Pkwy.)

exit and travel east to El Camino Real. Turn Blvd. exit and travel west, continuing on Real and then turn right on Dove Lane.

If traveling North on I-5, take the La Costa The Dove library will be on your left and there side of the main entrance.

World Of Orchids Show at the San Diego Botanic Garden

The World of Orchids Show will be held between May 4 and June 1 at the San Diego Botanic Garden.

This year will be the fifth year our society members can participate in the WOS, an event that has been well-received by the general San Diego community. Members will have the opportunity to display society plants during this year's show. This year SDBG Special Projects Manager, Felise Buckheart will coordinate the submissions and returns of member's orchids on Tuesdays during the show. The initial plant set up is on Wednesday April 30 and those members who participated last year should be on the list and should have gotten an email with details on how to submit your orchids. Please contact Felise Buckheart to be added to the list if you have not received her email or want to participate for the first time. You do not have to display plants every week during the show. Forms will be sent out on a weekly basis and plants will be dropped off and picked up on successive Tuesdays (May 6, 13, 20 and 27) with pick up at the end of the show on June 2.

Requirements for your display plants: 1) Clean and bug free - we don't want to introduce pests into the SDBG conservatory. 2) Clean pot, but no outer pot is necessary. If you provide an outer pot, make sure it has drainage holes. 3) Clearly labeled with plant name and your name. 4) Recently watered.

When you arrive with your plants, you will be given numbered ID tags to attach to your plants to further ensure that nothing gets lost. The plants will be in the show until the next Tuesday or longer if the flowers are still in good condition. Plants staying longer than one week, will be watered by the garden staff should they need it. Participating in this event is a lot of fun and gives our societies the opportunity to show visitors many of the beautiful orchid hybrids and species we grow to perfection. Society members who participate in showing their plants will receive a complementary year's membership to the garden and an entry pass for visits during the show that will allow up to 6 guests for each visit.

On weekends, show visitors can shop for unusual and unique orchids at the grower direct orchid market. During the show SDCOS members will be selling orchids the weekends of May 3-4 and 17-18 with the Orchid Conservation Alliance selling on May 10-11 and POS selling plants on Memorial Day weekend May 24-26. Additionally, other vendors will be selling from 10-5 every Sat. and Sun. and a few on select Fridays. Please refer to the SDBG website for more details on vendors, classes and general admission.

Admission to World of Orchids is free for members and kids under 18, \$7 per adult in addition to garden entrance fee for non-members. All attendees are encouraged to make a reservation online to obtain tickets for entry. Entrance is free for AOS members but you still need to register for tickets (under reciprocal) and show your ticket and AOS membership card upon entry. Make your reservation today for this exciting, month's long show.
