The best news of all is that we will be entering an orchid display. Nico has offered to build a small greenhouse (complete with automatic vents and a fogger for humidity) and a lath structure in an informal backyard garden setting. This will be used to display the various beautiful orchids that hobbyist grow and that are generally not available at stores.

The fair theme this year is 'THE FAB FAIR', a twist on The Fab Four, commemorating the 50th anniversary of the Beatles coming to America. The garden theme will be 'FLOWER POWER' and Nico has chosen the title 'OR-





CHIDS, BEETLES, AND OTHER POL-LINATORS - COME TOGETHER' for our display. The talk will highlight orchids and their pollinators (beetles foremost). Display boards, insect boxes, plus puzzles and other games will depict their importance to our world. This should be an attention grabber in the gardens. During volunteer attendance hours, the greenhouse will be unlocked for close up viewing of the orchids. Volunteers will answer questions.

POS members are encouraged to participate in this project. We will need the loan of orchid plants in bloom for the display (to be rotated out as needed; the loaned plants will be receiving the best of care). Volunteers will be needed for the information booth to cover as many days and hours as possible, most importantly during ORCHID DAY.

There will be a sign up sheet at the May 7 meeting for those of you who are interested in participating. Alternatively, you may contact Nico directly to learn more and sign up for helping to set up the display, loan plants, or volunteer as an ambassador during the running of the fair

Collector's Item: Cattleya tenebrosa

This is an article in the collector's item series of the AOS website. Check out <u>aos.org</u> for a list of beautiful and rare orchids and their descriptions.

Cattleya tenebrosa, one of the most spectacular of the former Brazilian laelias, was first described by Rolfe in 1891 as Laelia grandis var. tenebrosa in reference to its dark color compared to the yellow of L. grandis. The name tenebrosa doesn't just mean dark but rather implies a mysterious or supernatural quality. Two years later Rolfe, realizing this was a completely different species, described it



as Laelia tenebrosa, a name that has effective "stuck" for nearly a hundred years. This species is closely related to L. grandis and L. purpurata and they share many characteristics. The plants and flowers tend to be larger in all respects than those of *C.* (*L.*) grandis and even many clones of *C.* (*L.*) purpurata. The Brazilian laelias differ from cattleyas in that they typically have 8 pollinia rather than the 4 typical of cattleyas and in recent years there have been several proposed transfers to Sophronitis, Hadrolaelia, Brasilaelia, and Chironiella, although molecular analysis suggests that the entire group of Brazilian laelias is best treated by including them in the genus Cattleya.

The species typically produces two or three, very large (over 20cm - 8") flowers per growth. The sepals and petals of most clones is an unusual bronze or copper-brown and some clones can be exceptionally dark. Like C. (L.) purpurata, the petals tend to reflex along the midrib giving many clones a rather open appearance to the flower although linebreeding is beginning to flatten many newer clones. In addition to the typical dark clones a couple of

rare yellow cultivars exist. One of these yellow cultivars, *C*. (*L*.). tenebrosa 'Walton's Grange', FCC/AOS has figured prominently in the background of many exceptionally dark magenta and purple-red hybrids bred from *C*. dowiana and *C*. dowiana var. aurea.

The plants come from the southern parts of Bahia and Espirito Santo states of Brazil and flower in the early summer months.

Plants can be quite tall

with pseudobulbs up to 30 cm (12 inches) and a rigid leaf reaching another 30cm long. The two to four, very large flowers, are borne on a strong inflorescence that can also reach another 30 cm. Plants are easily cultivated under typical intermediate, Cattleya, conditions although they can be flowered with less light than *C.* (*L.*) purpurata. The plants are not nearly as tolerant of cold as C. (L.) purpurata which can be




exposed to brief periods near or even below freezing. When exposed to temperatures below their liking, the plants will develop lesions on the leaves and pseudobulbs that look much like spotty sunburn but often on only surface of the leaf and not completely through the leaf. When this happens, care should be taken to prevent secondary bacterial or fungal infections until the lesions dry and stabilize.

General Meeting Information

The Palomar Orchid Society regularly meets the FIRST WEDNESDAY of every month at the Pavilion at Lake San Marcos (1105 La Bonita Dr., San Marcos, CA 92078).

Traveling on State Route 78, take the Rancho Santa Fe exit and head South. The entrance to

the Lake San Marcos Resort is on your left about a 1/4 mile South of the San Marcos Blvd. intersection. Traveling on I5 South from Oceanside and North Carlsbad, take the Palomar Airport exit and turn right onto Rancho Santa Fe after about 7 miles. Traveling North on I5 from South Carlsbad and Encinitas, for example, take the La Costa Ave. exit and turn left onto Rancho Santa Fe. The entrance to the resort will be the first right after the fire station in San Marcos.

Inside the resort at the first "T" intersection, turn left on San Marino Drive. At the next 4way STOP, turn right on La Bonita Drive. Proceed ahead for one block on La Bonita. The pavilion will be on the left and there is parking in front of the pavilion.
