Panel of Orchid Experts

Preparing your Orchids for Winter

The October meeting will feature our second culture session of the year that will concentrate on "Preparing your Orchids for Winter". Panel members will include Nico Goosens (Lico Orchids), Karl Batchman (<u>Casa de las Orquideas</u>), Harry Philips (<u>Andy's Orchids</u>), and other expert growers.



Believe it or not, winter is approaching! Although it does not seem so with all the



warm weather we are having thus far. But to your orchids, the waning sun, shorter days and cooler evenings are telling them that it is time to start slowing down to begin their winter's rest. To others it is telling them that the mating (flowering) season is fast around the corner.

Cymbidiums also will be send up their spikes of wonderful colors with rainbow hues. Some dendrobiums will shrink if watered in winter, while others will welcome the chill to set next year's flowers. The Black Orchid and related members (cycnoches and catasetums) will drop their leaves and go into dormancy. Cold sensitive plants such as phalaenopsis, tolumnias, and most vandas will need to be brought in to avoid their demise. Potted orchids will need care different than orchids on sticks. Do you know how to care for your loved ones?

Join us on 2 October when your fellow orchid growers guide you into the chilly weather to come. Please bring your questions on winterizing your plants as well as any other orchid related questions you may have.

The opportunity table will be provided by the three commercial growers and should have a very nice collection of plants.

General Meeting Information

The Palomar Orchid Society regularly meets the **FIRST WEDNESDAY** of every month at the <u>Pavilion at Lake San Marcos</u> (1105 La Bonita Dr., San Marcos, CA 92078).

Traveling on State Route 78, take the Rancho Santa Fe exit and head South. The entrance to the Lake San Marcos Resort is on your left about a 1/4 mile South of the San Marcos Blvd. intersection.

Traveling on I5 South from Oceanside and North Carlsbad, take the Palomar Airport exit and turn right onto Rancho Santa Fe after about 7 miles.

Traveling North on I5 from South Carlsbad and Encinitas, for example, take the La Costa

Ave. exit and turn left onto Rancho Santa Fe. The entrance to the resort will be the first right after the fire station in San Marcos.

Inside the resort at the first "T" intersection, turn left on San Marino Drive. At the next 4way STOP, turn right on La Bonita Drive. Proceed ahead for one block on La Bonita. The pavilion will be on the left and there is parking in front of the pavilion.

Judging Sessions

The Pacific South Judging Center conducts each month three judging sessions in the Los Angeles and San Diego area. Locally, the sessions are held in Balboa Park, Casa del Prado in room 104 on the 1st Tuesday of the month at 6 pm.

Visitors, with or without plants, are welcome anytime. If a member of the POS wishes to have flowering plants judged at one of these sessions but is unable to take the plants to the judging facility, please contact one of the following AOS judges:

To Do List *cont*.

- Fall blooming cattlyeas and cymbidiums are beginning their blooming season. Provide adequate water and fertilizer but do so in the mornings so plants dry out before nightfall.
- Maintain good hygiene practices to minimize transmission of pests and viruses. Watch for fungus and bacterial rot as weather cools and wetter conditions prevail.
- More details on specific genera can be found on the <u>AOS website</u>

Indoors and Greenhouse

- Carefully monitor greenhouse temperatures and check that fans, automatic vents and heaters are in good working order.
- Continue to provide good air circulation for indoor plants to discourage diseases and pests such as mealy bugs and scale. Treat early to avoid spreading to other plants. More info on pests and diseases can be found at the <u>AOS</u> <u>website</u>.

• Start to cut back on watering and frequency of fertilizing as the days shorten and nights cool. Avoid over fertilizing to minimize root damage and soft growths. Keep to one half to one fourth the recommended amount on the package.

Outdoors

- Continue to monitor and control snails, slugs and pests as cooler and wet weather will bring them out. They can do considerable damage to plants in short order.
- Cattleyas should be in their fall blooming season as well as hardening off of growth produced in the spring and summer. Cut back on watering and frequency of fertilizing as plants slow down their growth rates.
- Cymbidiums should be developing spikes so switch from high nitrogen fertilizer to one with higher phosphorus and potassium (Hi Bloom such as 10-30-20) to initiate and stimulate spike production. Stake spikes early to train them to grow upright while spikes are flexible. See also the <u>AOS website</u> for more information.

- Although the best time to repot cymbidiums is in the early spring following blooming, plants can be repotted at this time if roots are deteriorating and media is decomposed in order to avoid loss of plants over the winter period.
- Catasetums/cycnoches are in their fall blooming period. Continue to give them warm temperatures, high light and fertilize well at each watering until you see them begin their dormant period by the yellowing and dropping of leaves. Cut back on water and fertilizer as suggested by Fred Clarke on <u>his</u> <u>website</u>.
- To induce your phalaenopsis to rebloom, subject them to 1-2 weeks of night temps of around 50°, but bring them in when night temps go below 50° as they are quite sensitive to cold. If you grow them in the house, put them in a cool room or near a window to obtain the lower night temps for spike initiation.
