## Satomi Kasahara

#### Neofinetia Falcata

Our guest speaker this month is Satomi Kasahara of <u>Seed Engei</u>. Her topic is *Neofinetia falcata*, an orchid native to Japan. She will discuss the history, culture and special methods that are used to judge this unique orchid.

The Japanese have been cultivating Neofinetia falcata (now officially named Vanda falcata) for over 400 years. In Japan, it is called Fūki-ran (富貴蘭), the orchid of the rich and noble people. Many years ago, only the rich and royalty could own them.

Satomi's father, Shigeru, started Seed Engei 35 years ago in Shiuzuoka, Japan. They specialize in growing *Neofinetia falcata* as well as other Japanese orchids. Satomi grew up around *Neofinetia falcata* and interacted with some of the best growers in Japan. She started working for her father in 2006. After a visit to Santa Barbara, he declared that the U.S. would be the perfect place to grow *Neofi-*

*netia falcata*. After that, Satomi started coming to orchid shows in California to expand the business.

She is the founder of the Fūkiran Society of America, created to promote Fūkiran growing in the United States, Canada and other parts the world. The Fūkiran Society of America is an offshoot of the Japan Fūkiran Society, which is responsible for registering *Neofinetia falcata* varieties. There are over 250 registered varieties, but if you add unregistered varieties to that, the total is 1000.

Every year, Satomi organizes a *Neofinetia falcata* judging event in Santa Barbara.

This is particularly desirable for positions of Treasurer, Publicity and Newsletter Editor.

**President:** This year, Alex completes his third term as President. He would like to find a suitable replacement so

he can serve POS in other capacities. Responsibilities consist of overseeing all activities for the society such as conducting monthly meeting and quarterly board meetings and working with other officers / members to advance the overall mission of the society.

1st VP Programs: Responsible for identifying, scheduling, introducing, making arrangements for monthly speakers and programs including write ups for the newsletter. #### General Meeting Information

The Palomar Orchid Society regularly meets the **FIRST WEDNESDAY** of every month at the <u>Pavilion at Lake San Marcos</u> (1105 La Bonita Dr., San Marcos, CA 92078).

Traveling on State Route 78, take the Rancho Santa Fe exit and head South. The entrance to

the Lake San Marcos Resort is on your left about a 1/4 mile South of the San Marcos Blvd. intersection. Traveling on I5 South from Oceanside and North Carlsbad, take the Palomar Airport exit and turn right onto Rancho Santa Fe after about 7 miles. Traveling North on I5 from South Carlsbad and Encinitas, for example, take the La Costa Ave. exit and turn left onto Rancho Santa Fe. The entrance to the

resort will be the first right after the fire station in San Marcos.

Inside the resort at the first "T" intersection, turn left on San Marino Drive. At the next 4-way STOP, turn right on La Bonita Drive. Proceed ahead for one block on La Bonita. The pavilion will be on the left and there is parking in front of the pavilion.


# **Guest Mentoring**


Our membership chair Sandi Sandquist is looking for help with the mentoring of guests.
