Genus Dendrobium: a Family Portrait of Dendrobium Species

We are delighted to welcome back Peter T. Lin to our society. Peter is one of our favorite speakers who will be talking about the Genus *Dendrobium*. He will present a fast paced PowerPoint presentation on this fascinating genus of over 1000 species!

Dendrobiums are primarily found in Asia, New Guinea and Australia. There are many different classifications within the genus, with species ranging from tiny miniatures to huge giants. They grow in climates ranging from hot and steamy lowlands, cool and moist mountain ranges, to seasonally dry savannas. Many are quite temperature tolerant and can be grown outside in frost-free areas. Peter will review a few of the important species in each classification. He will provide some basic cultural advice for each species, and there will be time for questions at the end of the program.

Peter started growing orchids over 35 years ago, but then stopped due to school and starting a career. It wasn't until about

14 years ago that the orchid "bug" came back and he is now heavily involved once again. He is an accredited judge with the

In our newsletter and at our meetings we ask the membership for suggestions on topics for our speakers and other suggestions for helping improve our society. Recently, one of our members won an award at the San Diego County Orchid Society show at the Scottish Rites Center and was interested in knowing more about what qualities judges look for in judging orchids. Many of our experienced members who regularly enter plants for judging know how to select plants for judging and prepare them so they look their best. The rest of us don't have a clue!! In response to that suggestion, we have made arrangements to have Fred Clarke give a talk on this subject for the January 2018 meeting. As many of you know, Fred is an accredited AOS judge who has won many awards and is an excellent person to speak on this topic.



General Meeting Information

The Palomar Orchid Society regularly meets the **FIRST WEDNESDAY** of every month at the <u>Pavilion at Lake San Marcos</u> (1105 La Bonita Dr., San Marcos, CA 92078).

Traveling on State Route 78, take the Rancho Santa Fe exit and head South. The entrance to

the Lake San Marcos Resort is on your left about a 1/4 mile South of the San Marcos Blvd. intersection. Traveling on I5 South from Oceanside and North Carlsbad, take the Palomar Airport exit and turn right onto Rancho Santa Fe after about 7 miles. Traveling North on I5 from South Carlsbad and Encinitas, for example, take the La Costa Ave. exit and turn left onto Rancho Santa Fe. The

entrance to the resort will be the first right after the fire station in San Marcos.

Inside the resort at the first "T" intersection, turn left on San Marino Drive. At the next 4-way STOP, turn right on La Bonita Drive. Proceed ahead for one block on La Bonita. The pavilion will be on the left and there is parking in front of the pavilion.

Novice Dendrobium Culture Sheet

Dendrobium is a diverse genus of orchids with different cultural needs. This culture

information is for the phalenopsis-type Dendrobiums which are evergreen with thin, tall stems (pseudobulbs). The complete culture sheet and many others can also be found at the AOS website.

Water – Water your orchids in the morning so that the leaves are dry before night. *Dendrobiums* like to be in small pots and are usually much taller than the pot is wide. Because they are usually large plants in relatively small pots, watering twice a week is about average. They like to be almost dry before re-watering.

When watering, place the plant in the sink and use tepid water. Do not use salt-softened or distilled water. Let the water run through the plant for a minute or so. Be sure to let the plant drain completely.

This is a good time to look closely at your plant for any sign of insects or disease.

Light – *Dendrobiums* need lots of light, but not direct sun. A lightly shaded south window is best. East or west facing windows are satisfactory if bright (avoid direct sun except at the beginning or end of the day).

Temperature – *Dendrobiums* can withstand hot weather if adequate ventilation and humidity are provided. They are best grown when the temperature is between 65°F and

75°F in the day and between 55°F to 60°F at night.

Fertilizer – Any balanced orchid fertilizer (look at the numbers on the container, 20-20-20, etc.) can be used to fertilize your orchid. Feed weakly (1/4 strength) weekly works well for *Dendrobiums*. Once a month use clear water to flush any accumulated salts from the potting mix.

Tips – Use a shallow tray of pebbles filled with water to increase humidity around your plants. Be sure the pot does not sit in water as this will rot the roots.

Give your plants room for air to circulate around them. Crowding of plants can lead to problems with insect infestations and fungus.

When your plant has finished blooming, you can cut the flowering stem at the point where it came out of the tall thin pseudobulbs. Do not cut off the tall thin stem because the new flower stem will grow from there. Continue watering and fertilizing and within a year a new growth will spike to begin the blooming cycle again!

When re-potting, use a small pot; using a large pot will slow growth and reduces flowering significantly. Re-pot every two to three years.


Welcome, Jim Anderson!


