

September's Speaker: James Rose 'My 10 Favorite Orchids'

We are delighted to welcome back James Rose of Cal-Orchid, Santa Barbara to speak to our society. James and his wife, Lauris, are the owners of Cal-Orchid, a very successful and favorite nursery of many of our members. James is a highly experienced orchid nurseryman who will share with us his '10

Favorite Orchids', which encompass a large variety of orchid species from around the world. James talks are always educational and highly entertaining so I urge our members and friends to attend his talk. James also will provide our plant table.

James is being sponsored jointly by POS and SDCOS, He will be speaking on the same subject at the SDCOS meeting on Tuesday, Sept. 3, if you are unable to attend on Wednesday evening.

James attended UC Santa
Barbara as an anthropology
major. In 1971 he began working
at Santa Barbara Orchid Estate.
16 years later, now the nursery's
manager, he left to established
his own nursery with his wife,
Lauris. In 1987 they purchased
Orchids By Rowe, a 2 acre
cymbidium nursery 2 blocks
from the Pacific Ocean. Jim and
Lauris totally redesigned the
former cymbidium cut flower
business to what is now a world

renowned orchid nursery providing one of the largest varieties of orchid species and hybrids in the U.S.

Cal-Orchid maintains an active breeding program and a stud collection built upon decades of international travel. James is very well known for having a distinctively selective 'eye' for the new, unusual plant, and Cal-Orchid's customers enjoy reaping the benefits.

The nursery's inventory features plants from the Cattleya, Cymbidium, Odontoglossum, Masdevallia, Lycaste, Paphiopedilum alliances as well as a good assortment of African species. James and Lauris have become recognized for their superior 'Pacific' line of reedstem Epidendrums, which have been developed over 12 years of selective breeding and have garnered awards around the world.

James has published in the AOS, Orchid Digest, and CSA magazines, and is well respected for his vast knowledge as well as his distinctive sense of humor. He lectures all over the world–from Japan to South Africa, to Europe, at orchid shows, and World Orchid Conferences.

He is a Cymbidium Society of America Judge, former member of the AOS Conservation Committee, and active member of the Japan Grand Prix
Organizing committee where he has judged every year at the world famous Tokyo Dome Show.

President's Message

Hello POS Members and Friends,

This month we are very pleased to welcome back Jim Rose of Cal-Orchid in Santa Barbara. Jim has always been one of our favorite and most entertaining speakers. Last month, Authur Pinkers gave a nice talk to our society and we had a very nice plant table provided by our Co-President, Alex Nadzan. It's always nice when one of our members can share their collection with us. The plant table was as nice or nicer than many that we get from other speakers. The board met recently and it is one of our goals to try and get very nice plant tables every month. This can be a challenge some months.

To date, no one has volunteered to help out with our holiday dinner. It appears many of our members are too busy or do not want to participate more actively. This is unfortunate. So as of this writing, we do not have plans yet and it will be more difficult to find restaurants in

December within our budget.

As we approach the last month of summer, we need to pay more attention to watering our plants. The hotter days means you may have to water 1 or 2 days sooner than your regular schedule. If you don't already have one, you may consider buying a mister or fogger to help cool down your plants on the hottest days. You can find these at your local nursery or online. They are not expensive. We also suggest you refer to the AOS website or POS website for tips on what needs to be done during the summer months.

Last month was our first month without Merle Robboy who has moved back to Orange County. Instead of Merle's informative discussion of the plants, we had several members talk about the plants they brought and shared the secrets to their success. While this takes a few minutes longer than Merle's overview, we hope you found it informative. We think our members enjoyed this as well. We will continue to mix it up as we decide how best describe the plants.

The board met recently to discuss several topics impacting our society. One item we are paying close attention to is the location of our monthly meetings. We would like to keep it at the Lake San Marcos, Conference Center, but LSM has not announced their pricing for 2020 yet. If there is too much of an increase, we will have to explore other venues. The cost

of holding meetings, paying speaker fees and plant tables is getting more expensive and we have limited sources of revenue. Our primary fundraiser, the auction, did not net as much as in prior years and our meeting room rent continues to increase. We welcome any contribution members may give and, if you have mandatory IRA withdrawals and want to donate directly to a non-profit organization, please consider POS. There are some tax benefits to donating directly from your IRA.

We hope our meetings are informative, enjoyable, and keep your interest. We want to continue providing excellent programs and need your feedback in order to improve. So far this year, Bill and Alex have not been contacted but we keep praying for your input.

As was done last year, SDCOS would like to arrange a bus trip to the Huntington on Saturday, October 19th. A signup sheet is available via the 'Volunteers' tab on the SDCOS website.

If you are interested in going (est \$50 to \$60) on the all day trip, please signup on the website. This year SDCOS will be asking for payment in advance. Last year's trip did not pay for itself. A number of people signed up and then were unable to make

General Meeting Information

The Palomar Orchid Society regularly meets the FIRST WEDNESDAY of every month at the Conference Center at Lake San Marcos (1105 La Bonita Dr., San Marcos, CA 92078).

Traveling on State Route 78, take the Rancho Santa Fe exit and head South. The entrance to the Lake San Marcos Resort is on your left about a 1/4 mile and South of the San Marcos Blvd. intersection. Traveling on I5 South from Oceanside and North Carlsbad, take the Palomar Airport exit and turn right onto Rancho Santa Fe after about 7 miles. Traveling North on I5 from South Carlsbad and Encinitas, for example, take the La Costa Ave. exit and turn left onto Rancho Santa Fe. The entrance to the resort will be the first right after the fire station in San Marcos.

Inside the resort at the first "T" intersection, turn left on San Marino Drive. At the next 4-way STOP, turn right on La Bonita Drive. Proceed ahead for one block on La Bonita. The conference center will be on the left and there is plenty of parking in front.
