# Tim Culbertson

# Laelia anceps, a Treasure of Mexico

We welcome back one of our favorite speakers, Tim Culbertson, who will give us a presentation on 'Laelia anceps, a Treasure of Mexico'. Although large, these spectacular cattleyas grow well outside in our subtropical climate and with their myriad colors and free-blooming tendencies, they are great plants for every collection. California is a hot-bed of interest in Laelia anceps types and hybrids, and has been for years. Tim will explore the species' influence in hybrids, and how breeders have made combinations of naturally occurring forms to create entirely new strains. By the end of this presentation, attendees will have a new appreciation of the range of color forms of Laelia anceps and its hybrids, as well as an appreciation of their beautiful flowers and ease-of-growth. Tim's talk is not to be missed and he will be providing a

plant table that includes some wonderful select divisions and seedlings of Laelia anceps and its hybrids.

Although Tim teaches middle school kids for a living, one of his passions has always been plants. Tim began growing orchids as an offshoot from working at Longwood Gardens in Philadelphia just after college. From the very beginning it was all about Paphiopedilums, particularly awarded and select clones of historic importance, of which his collection num-

### PRESIDENTS' MESSAGE

### Hello POS Members and Friends,

We had our third in-person POS meeting last month with excellent attendance. Besides our regular members, we were joined by several visitors from the Lake San Marcos community and everyone enjoyed the informative talk given by Carlos Lopez of Sunset Valley Orchids.

As announced at the August meeting, effective September 1st, POS will be meeting at the Carlsbad Dove Library located at 1775 Dove Lane, Carlsbad. Dove Lane is off of El Camino Real just north of the intersection of El Camino Real and Aviary Parkway. We have reserved the Gowland Meeting room thru December 2021 and plan to reserve it again for January thru June 2022 when next year's reservation system opens in September. The meeting room is adjacent to the entrance to the library and has its own entrance near the Art Gallery. Next month, as an added bonus, the gallery will have a new exhibit on display which opens that week. It is a free exhibit and the city typically has excellent art exhibits for the community. *Come early and enjoy the exhibit.* 

PLEASE, DO NOT go to the Lake San Marcos Conference Center. We enjoyed meeting in the spacious meeting room, and it was a convenient location for many of our members. Unfortunately, the meeting room rate increased over the past few years and became unaffordable. The Dove *Library is a smaller venue but large* enough to accommodate our meetings. There is ample, well-lit parking and the rates are about one third that of the LSM Conference Center. We hope all of our members and visitors continue to attend the meetings even if it may be a few miles further away. For many of our members it is more convenient, so overall, it is a great change.

The matching fund campaign is off to a good start. After 2 months (of the 4month campaign) we have achieved about \$1700 of donations (cash and plants) towards our goal of \$2500! If you haven't already done so, please consider donating. All donations are welcomed and appreciated. If we reach \$2500 of donations by October 31st, POS will receive \$5000 in total with the matching gift.



Our speaker for September is Tim Culbertson who will speak on 'Laelia anceps, a Treasure of Mexico'. Tim is an expert grower and excellent speaker who has spoken to our group before. He will discuss Laelia anceps as an easy to grow species in Southern California and as a parent of numerous desirable hybrids. We welcome Tim back. It's important to note that Carlsbad, and many other cities, are requiring masks for indoor events at city facilities, including for vaccinated individuals. Take the time to give your collection more attention during these summer months. Some orchids are still producing new roots so they still can be divided and/or repotted at this time.

As mentioned in the previous newsletters, we encourage our member to send in your annual membership renewal via mail or <u>on-line using the POS website</u>. ### General Meeting Information

The Palomar Orchid Society regularly meets the **FIRST WEDNESDAY** of every month at the <u>George and Patricia Gowland Meeting</u> <u>Room located in the Carlsbad City Library</u> on Dove Lane, just off El Camino Real in southern Carlsbad. The address is <u>1775 Dove Lane</u>, <u>Carlsbad, CA 92011</u>. Traveling South on I-5, take the Poinsettia Ln. exit and travel east to El Camino Real. Turn right on El Camino Real and turn right again on Dove Lane.

If traveling North on I-5, take the La Costa Ave. exit and travel east to El Camino Real. Turn left on Dove Lane (first traffic light after Aviara Pkwy.) Traveling West on S-78, take the San Marcos Blvd. exit and travel west, continuing on Palomar Airport Rd.. Turn left on El Camino Real and then turn right on Dove Lane.

The Dove library will be on your left and there is a large, well-lit parking lot. The Gowland Meeting Room is located on the right hand side of the main entrance.

# New POS Meeting Location

As mentioned in the President's Message, as of September 1, our meetings will be conducted in the <u>Gowland Meeting room</u> <u>at the Carlsbad City Library (Dove Library)</u>. For those of you who are not familiar with the facility, the Dove Library is located at <u>1775 Dove Lane, Carlsbad</u>, <u>CA 92011</u>. Dove Lane is off of El Camino Real, just north of the intersection of Aviara Parkway and El Camino Real in Carlsbad. The Gowland Meeting Room is a state-of-the-art facility, the entrance of which is located to the right of the library entrance and adjacent to the Art Gallery (see pic with red arrow below).

Our meeting will start promptly at the regular time of 6:30 pm and will end no later than 9:30 pm. Should members want to continue conversations, they may do so after on the patio in the library courtyard. POS asks that all attendees be fully vaccinated and, due to the recent surge in COVID infections, the City of Carlsbad requires every one to wear face masks in city owned facilities, regardless of whether they are unvaccinated or fully vaccinated. Please wear your masks! We will have extras if you forget to bring yours. We look forward to seeing you there.



# AOS Judging To Resume

AOS Judging at the Casa del Prado (room 104) in Balboa Park will resume on September 7, 2021.

The following COVID-19 protocols for exhibitors and judges will be in effect:

Upon arrival at the judging site, personnel and exhibitors will be asked the following questions:

- Have they had contact in the last week with anyone who has been ill or documented to be positive for COVID
- Do they have any symptoms (fever, dry cough or tiredness, loss of taste or smell, headaches, sore throat, diarrhea)

If the answer to either question is yes, they will be asked to leave.

Following CDC guidelines, masks are recommended to be used indoors. Please consult the official resources of the city of San Diego and the county for any mandatory requirements.

One person will be designated as the greeter. Exhibitors will be greeted at the door and asked the above health protocol questions.

One exhibitor will be permitted in the room at a time to fill out the entry form at the front desk and drop off the plant(s). If there is more than one exhibitor at a time, others are asked to wait in line outside the room following social distancing.

Once the plant has been screened or judged and photographed, the exhibitor will be called to pick up the plant at the front desk.

bers nearly 3000. While he loves finding old, rare stepping stones in Paph breeding, he also dabbles in a little hybridizing of his own and finds that growing up "babies" of his own is a blast.

Tim is an accredited judge with the American Orchid Society and has served in various capacities with several orchid societies in California as well as on the East Coast. Tim loves meeting other people who share his love for orchids and doing so often finds Tim traveling to shows, vendors, and peoples' greenhouses to see the latest and greatest in new hybrids and to get the best orchid gossip. Tim likes to be involved with plants as much as possible. In addition to Longwood, Tim has worked at the Smithsonian Institution tending to their orchids, and for years for the United States National Arboretum, collecting rare plants and documenting cultivated species and hybrids for their herbarium.

# September To Do List

### General

In spite of the day length becoming shorter in September, this month can still produce very warm days for continued growth of your plants. Watch them carefully and provide adequate water and fertilizer before tapering off when warm days begin to wane.

Some cattlyeas and other genera (dendrobiums, oncidiums) are still in active growth mode so take the opportunity to repot those you may have missed before month's end to allow enough growth before the onset of cooler weather and initiation of the dormancy period.

Maintain good hygiene practices to minimize transmission of pests and viruses, particularly during the warm summer months when pests and diseases can proliferate very quickly and spread throughout the collection. Carefully inspect plants for scale and aphids and treat early to minimize spread.

More details on specific genera can be found on the <u>AOS website</u>.



## Indoors and Greenhouse

Carefully monitor greenhouse temperatures as higher summer and early fall temperatures can easily cook plants. Make sure fans and automatic vents are in good working order. Mist plants to increase humidity and cool down temperatures.

Continue to provide good air circulation for indoor plants to discourage diseases and pests such as mealy bugs and scale. Treat early to avoid spreading to other plants. More info on pests and diseases can be found at the <u>AOS</u> <u>website</u>. Maintain increased watering and fertilizer to accommodate growth during this period. Avoid over fertilizing to minimize root damage and growth of soft growths. Keep to one half to one fourth the recommended amount on the package.

### Outdoors

Continue to monitor and control snails, slugs and pests during this period. They can do considerable damage to plants in short order.

Cattleyas should be coming into the fall blooming season as well as hardening off of growth produced in the spring and summer. Maintain watering frequency and cut back on fertilizer as growths mature.

Early blooming cymbidiums should be developing spikes so switch from high nitrogen fertilizer to one with higher phosphorus and potassium (Hi Bloom such as 10-30-20) to initiate and stimulate spike production. See also <u>the</u> <u>AOS website</u> for more information.

Catasetums/cycnoches should begin their fall blooming period during this month. Continue to give them warm temperatures, high light and fertilize well at each watering until you see them begin their dormancy period by the yellowing and dropping of leaves. Cut back on water and fertilizer as suggested by Fred Clarke on <u>his website</u>.

To induce your phalaenopsis to rebloom, subject them to 1-2 weeks of night temps of around 50 °F, but bring them in when night temps go below 50 °F as they are sensitive to cold. If you grow them in the house, put them in a cool room or near a window to obtain the lower night temps for spike initiation.
